#### ISSTI members secure major interdisciplinary awards

**UKRI Research node on Governance of Autonomous Systems** 

Stuart Anderson, Lachlan Urquhart, Burkhard Schafer and Robin Williams are coinvestigators in a landmark new interdisciplinary award on the Governance and
Regulation of Trustworthy Autonomous Systems in transport and health and social care.

This £3.2 million award, led by Professor Subramanian Ramamoorthy from the School of Informatics,
brings together researchers with backgrounds in Computer Science and AI, Law, AI ethics, Science
and Technology Studies and Design Ethnography from King's College London, the University of
Nottingham, Heriot-Watt University, University of Glasgow and the University of Sussex. More

#### **Prof Jan Webb Co-opted onto Scottish Science Advisory Council**

Professor Jan Webb has been co-opted onto the Scottish Science Advisory Council to advise government on energy and climate change policies. Due to their expertise in the development of low carbon infrastructure, Jan was appointed to the Commission and formed part of the team that published the Infrastructure Commission for Scotland Report this summer.

In the draft 5 Year Infrastructure Investment Plan, Scottish Government have accepted the main recommendations of the Commission's first Report on investing for an inclusive, net zero emissions society, and are seeking views on how to implement these.

#### Dr Kirsten Jenkins Leads Work on Energy and Just Transitions

Dr Kirsten Jenkins has been appointed as co-chair of the third Energy Research & Social Science conference, which is set to take place in Manchester in September 2021. The conference, which will focus on Climate and Energy Transformations, will bring together hundreds of energy research and social science scholars from across the globe.

Dr Jenkins has also recently been selected as one of the members of the COP26 Universities Network working group on the Just Transition. As the University of Edinburgh representative, she joins more than 45 UK-based universities and research centres informing the progress of the UN Climate Summit. They have recently published a briefing summarising their initial findings.



## Dr Jarita Holbrook Wins Awards for "The Science Tourists" and "Black Suns: An Astrophysics Adventure"



Jarita Holbrook has been busy making videos for conferences and the larger public. They won a prize for Excellence at the 2020 WRPN Global Webisode Competition for their episode of The Science Tourists focused on Tenerife, Spain. This award-winning episode is available on <u>YouTube</u>.

Similarly, their film Black Suns: An Astrophysics Adventure has won an award at the 2020 Natourale Nature & Tourism Film Festival in Wiesbaden, Germany, though which award won't be revealed until November 28th!

For the Bicentennial celebration of the South African Astronomical Observatory, they made a five-minute poster video covering their oral history project focused on South Africa astronomy. As part of their Research Data Alliance activities (RDA Plenary will be in Edinburgh April 2021!), the CARE principles of Indigenous Data Governance has been published in the <a href="Data Science">Data Science</a> Journal.

Holbrook presented on their ASTROMOVES project at 4S/EASST Prague and will present at the International Astronomical Union Education & Heritage in the Era of Big Data symposium in December.


# ISSTI member recognised in Queen's birthday honours for 2020.


#### Prof Catherine Lyall's book featured in Times Higher Education article
